What's the Young People's Forum all about?

Up to **15 participants** (16-25 years old) at any given time will represent young people and *Keeping it Wild* participants at a Young People's Forum. A key remit of the Forum will be to improve LWT's communications and marketing strategy for engaging young Londoners in the city's natural heritage.
